## Island In The Sun - Weezer



## RASPBERRY LEMONADE SLUSHIE

### Ingredients:

- 1 cup fresh or frozen raspberries
- 1/2 cup fresh lemon juice (about 3–4 lemons)
- 1/2 cup sugar (adjust to taste)
- 2 cups ice cubes
- 1 cup cold water

### Instructions:

1. In a blender, combine raspberries, lemon juice, sugar, and water.
2. Blend until the mixture is smooth.
3. Add ice cubes and blend again until slushy.
4. Taste and adjust sweetness if needed.
5. Pour into glasses and serve!



## RASPBERRY LEMONADE SLUSHIE

5. Pour into a glass and enjoy immediately for a refreshing tropical treat!


